UWC Members representing CFUW at the United Nations Conference on the Status of Women in New York

Did you know that CFUW is UWC's mother organization? **Two UWC members, Mary Scott and Sandy Millen, have been chosen to attend, representing both UWC and CFUW.** The

Local women attending United Nations Commission on the Status of Women in New York City

This year marks the 30th anniversary of the Fourth World Conference on Women, held in Beijing in 1995. The Conference was a defining moment in the feminist movement, with more than 17,000 people attending from around the world. It produced the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action, a global framework for securing gender equality.

At the 69th Commission on the Status of Women (CSW69) in March 2025, civil society organizations, activists, and member states will gather to assess the progress made since the 1995 Conference. Held annually at United Nations headquarters in New York, CSW is the main intergovernmental body dedicated exclusively to the promotion of gender equality and the empowerment of women and girls throughout the world.

Mary Scott and Sandy Millen of Winnipeg will represent CFUW (Canadian Federation of University Women) as a part of the organization's delegation to CSW69 from March 10 to 21. CFUW is a women's organization with 6,700 members in 90 Clubs throughout Canada, including the local Club, University Women's Club of Winnipeg.. Founded in 1919, CFUW holds Special Consultative Status with the United Nations, which allows it to send 20 delegates to CSW.

"I attended the Beijing Conference back in 1995, and I must say the world is just as challenging, if not more so. I raise my voice with the many around the world to respect the human rights of the many who are facing violence and torture", says Mary Scott, CFUW delegate.

Mary Scott and Sandy Millen look forward to sharing their experiences at the United Nations with local community leaders and members of the University Women's Club of Winnipeg.

Hello Everyone!

Hope you are keeping cozy in this frigid weather!

Carriage House update: Imrie Demolition applied for the demolition permits from the City in December. Rina Basco of the City Heritage Conservation Department has now approved their portion of the application after requesting another meeting and asking for more documentation on the project, such as additional photos and reports. Alpha Masonry will be removing all the red tapestry bricks and stonework from the front of the Carriage House before the demolition. Alpha has kindly offered to store the pallets of bricks and stone at no cost until a permanent storage structure is built on the property. The saved brick and stone will then be used in the new building.

We have encountered another challenge regarding this demolition: Allison Davies, a City Waterways Technologist with the City Waterways Section, has asked for the involvement of an additional Engineering Specialist who deals specifically with waterways issues. She has requested that Imrie arrange for him to prepare a detailed report on this project before approving our permit. We remain hopeful that this demolition can take place by the middle of March; however, our window of opportunity is rapidly diminishing. For Imrie to bring in the heavy equipment required for the demolition, the ground must stay frozen. Fingers crossed, everyone!!

FRCH has applied for several grants:

- The window replacement assessment is \$27,000 plus tax, and it is required by all three levels of Government for any work done to a Historic building.
- A grant to replace the damaged soffits and downspouts. This is our top priority, as it is causing water damage to the wall on the mezzanine.

We will know if our grant applications have been approved by the end of April this year. If the grants are approved, the work on replacing the soffits and downspouts should be able to commence in the Spring.
